safe steps is the state-wide not-for-profit service for women and children experiencing violence and abuse from a partner or ex-partner, another family member or someone close to them.

safe steps provides emergency accommodation, a free 24-hour crisis line, outreach services, advocacy, referral, and information and support services to enable women and children to become – and stay – free from violence.

safe steps is staffed by women and you can call confidentially 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for:

- Support, if you need to talk to someone about how you are feeling and what your options may be.
- Information on family violence support services, legal rights and accommodation options.
